a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance,


a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing,


> a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away,

The board of Trustees has completed many improvements and repairs to the church and the patronage.

Our Church:


The new furnace has proved to be a wonderful investment. We are saving tremendous money by

converting to an energy-efficient gas system. We want to thank MIKE MURPHY'S LANDSCAPING, (860) 599-5981, for his wonderful job plowing our church's parking lot. All the church's downstairs bathroom water valves have been replaced or refurbished. The Board of Trustees attached a cable system in the sanctuary by the stained-glass cross window for the Worship Team to attach beautiful draperies. They also added colored led lights behind

the same cross. Trustees have repaired the roof at the church that suffered some minor wind damage that occurred over the winter. We have added new outside water spigots and building sealant.

The back hall of the church has been painted a beautiful new bright blue. The playground has a new roof and has been stained. Our new outside library space on the front Narthex porch, called the "Narthex Nook," now has cards with community internet access and a charging station. There is now a bench and birdbath next to the playground in our flower garden. The Narthex floor is repaired, and the heat is now working. We purchased a small refrigerator for our gatherings after Sunday's Service.





The Pastor's Parsonage:

We have replaced the front and back doors. New plumbing in the upstairs bathroom and a new kitchen ceiling. New drainpipe in the basement. Replacement of all screens in the windows. And repairs were made to the garage. Trustees are pleased to report that all major repairs we had on our list for the past year have been fixed. Next year, we must address repairing and painting the ceilings and walls. The wood floors may need refinishing. Considering the savings the Church has received from the new furnace and the fact that a natural gas line is already supplied, we should also consider replacing the parsonage with an energy-efficient gas system. Long term, we will need to think about updating the electrical service.
